Dear Project Safety Net (PSN) Partners and Palo Alto Community Members,

Project Safety Net and the City of Palo Alto are committed to promoting health and preventing suicide in the community. An important combined focus of Project Safety Net, the City, and Palo Alto Unified School District continues to be on youth wellbeing.

We learned that a young adult from our community died on the railways this past Tuesday. The San Mateo County Sheriff's Office Transit Police are still investigating the incident, and the family has asked for privacy. PSN leadership and partners, including the City of Palo Alto, together believe that this is an important moment to reinforce the hope, help, and strength that exists in our community, especially as we enter the holiday season in a post-pandemic environment. PSN partners including the City, are prepared to respond to this loss by:

- Connecting with family, friends, and those impacted by the death.
- Communicating the loss and providing resources to families, caregivers, neighbors, and the workforce.
- Convening PSN Means Restriction Advisory Group to review practices, assess safety efforts, and identify priorities.
- Furthering our collective work through continuous training and sharing resources.

During this time, healing, self-care, and linking to resources are vital for all members of our community. See the second page of this letter for resources to help during this difficult time.

This Monday, November 1st, PSN's Partners Council will have its regular meeting, which will include discussion regarding coalition partners' suicide postvention efforts.

Together, we are grateful to work alongside the caring community members who are dedicated to ensuring the well-being of our young people.
